Students will also learn about the complexities of contemporary politics, they will improve their language ability and gain useful skills for the business world.

They will also learn about the principles of modern international relations, as well as their historic, political, and economic determinants. In addition, students will gain valuable insight about the policy decisions and economic

developments that operate in an international context, and will develop skills that will help them work effectively in teams and communicate successfully in an international environment.

# MA IN INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS



- Three-year undergraduate program taught entirely in English
- Graduates get two degrees – one from Lazarski University and one from Coventry University

Understanding international relations can help you affect the decisions made by governments, corporations and other institutions, and studying international relations can lead to many careers, including diplomatic service, international business, non-profit organizations, and law. The MA in IR program is administered in conjunction with Coventry University in Great Britain and consists of two main components:

1. IR classes taught in semesters one and two, plus a Master's thesis and seminar, and
2. additional IR courses during semesters three and four, which are part of the European Administration or Contemporary Politics specializations.

In order to receive just a degree from Coventry University, students must complete the first year of coursework and their Master's thesis. In order to receive two degrees, one from Coventry University and one from Lazarski University, students must complete two-years of coursework plus their Master's thesis.

## Contemporary Politics Specialization

Through the elective courses encompassed in the Contemporary Politics specialization, students will broaden their knowledge of global issues by learning about geopolitics, statesmanship, limits of power, differences between the cultural, legal, and political approaches to modernity of the USA and European Union, Chinese Civilization and the Far East, as well as other topics.

## European Administration Specialization

The specialization was created to train competent multi-lingual specialists in European Union affairs and policy, as well as to give International Relations students the training and support necessary to successfully compete for employment competitions to European Union institutions, and for agencies and corporations that cooperate closely with the EU.

# MSC IN INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS ECONOMICS



- Two-year Master's program taught entirely in English
- Graduates get two degrees – one from Lazarski University and one from Coventry University

The MSc in International Business Economics Program is designed to give students an understanding of the structures, organizations and management of international companies, and also to prepare them for a career in business and management, especially in international corporations. The program is administered in conjunction with Coventry University in Great Britain and consists of two main components:

1. economics classes taught entirely in English in the first year, plus a Master's thesis and seminar, and
2. additional economics courses taught during the second year.

In order to receive just a degree from Coventry University, students must complete the first year of coursework and their Master's thesis. In order to receive two degrees, one from Coventry University and one from Lazarski University, students must complete two-years of coursework plus their Master's thesis.

# BA IN ECONOMICS

## ***Business Economics Specialization***

## ***E-Business Specialization***

This specialization is designed to meet the growing market demand for economic specialists with knowledge of computer programming and E-business. Students will learn how to manage internet projects and how best to promote them. They will also learn the basics of script language programming, find out how to build a website of, among other things, online shops.

The specialization was created to train competent multi-lingual specialists in European Union affairs and policy, as well as to give International Relations students the training and support necessary to successfully compete for employment competitions to European Union institutions, and for agencies and corporations that cooperate closely with the EU.

- two-year Master's program taught entirely in English

# INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS

---

In addition to traditional degree-granting programs, Lazarski University offers a variety of certificate programs which have been developed with international partners. These include: LL.M. In International Business Practice and the International Legal Skills Program which are ran in conjunction with the Center of International Legal Studies in Salzburg Austria, as well as the Russian Law Program which is ran in conjunction with the Academic Law University in Moscow.

## LL.M. IN INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS PRACTICE

---

Three-year certificate program taught in English

- Joint-Certificate from Lazarski University and Center of International Legal Studies in Salzburg

The LL.M. in International Business Practice provides an emphasis on international business, trade, dispute resolution, and the cross border practice of law. An optional concentration in American law is offered within the program. The LL.M. comprises of three cycles in a three-year period. Cycles I and II are taught in Salzburg, Austria, by faculty provided by the Center for International Legal Studies, Lazarski University, and Salzburg University. Cycle III is taught in Warsaw, Poland, by faculty provided by Lazarski University. Furthermore, in order to complete the program a directed research project or participation in any two of the Center's several continuing legal education programs offered annually in Europe, North America, and other venues throughout the world, have to be completed.

## INTERNATIONAL LEGAL SKILLS

---

- One-year certificate program taught in English
- Joint-Certificate from Lazarski University and Center of International Legal Studies in Salzburg

The International Legal Skills Program is a joint-certificate program administered by Lazarski University and Center for International Legal Studies in Salzburg. It is a one year course, taught in English. It is designed for lawyers practicing international law who aim to update their skills connected to international legal practice. The ILSP is taught by well-known foreign practicing attorneys, as well as foreign specialists in the legal field. Top students are eligible for summer internships at participating law firms.

## RUSSIAN LAW PROGRAM

---

- One-year program taught in Russian
- Joint-Certificate from Lazarski University and Academic Law University in Moscow

The first and only such program in Poland. It is organized each year since December 2002, in collaboration with the Academic Law University in Moscow, acting at the Institute of State and Law of the Russian Academy of Sciences. The program is designed to give students the opportunity to learn about the laws in force in Russia. Lectures are conducted in Russian, by professors from Moscow and include constitutional law and civil procedure and administrative, arbitration, banking law, tax law, and the right to control internal trade in the Russian Federation. Classes are supplemented by a course in Russian language, covering mainly legal and commercial language. Graduates receive a diploma from the Academic Legal University in Moscow and Lazarski University.
