Application Information

The University of Vermont uses the Common Application. Go to www.commonapp.org to apply. Add UVM to your "My Colleges" list. Deadlines and detailed entrance requirements may be viewed at www.uvm.edu/admissions/undergraduate/applying/. In addition to the Common Application, please submit:

- \$55 USD application fee (waived for Early Action candidates)
- Official copies of secondary school and any university level transcripts. If these transcripts are not in English, we require both the original and a certified translation into English.
- One letter of recommendation. If this letter is not in English, please include a translation.
- Official SAT or ACT scores sent by the testing agency. Transfer students do not need to submit SAT or ACT results.
- Official TOEFL or IELTS scores submitted directly by the testing agency (for students whose first language is not English).

Students with TOEFL iBT scores of 90 or IELTS of 6.5 can apply directly for undergraduate admission at the University of Vermont. For international students who meet UVM admissions requirements, but need additional English language support, the UVM Global Gateway Program provides an undergraduate pathway that combines English training and 28-30 UVM course credits.
